Campaign for Human Development Collection Next Week: Next weekend there will be a special collection taken up at all the Masses to support the Campaign for Human Development. The proceeds from this collection support outreach programs in the United States aimed at raising people out of poverty through education, training and support. Envelopes for this collection are in the pews. *(There will be no second collection taken up. If you would like to contribute, place your contribution in the envelope and put it in with the regular collection.)*

Thanksgiving Day Mass: Mass will be celebrated on Thanksgiving Day, November 24, at 9:00 a.m. This is a great way to begin the holiday by thanking God for the blessings He has bestowed upon our Nation and family.

New Rite of Marriage: On November 27, the new rite of marriage for the Catholic Church will become effective. **The major change in the rite is the restriction of celebration a Catholic**

nuptial Mass unless both the bride and groom are Catholic. If one spouse is non-Catholic, a scripture service and marriage rite is celebrated but without the Mass.

Cremation and the Catholic Church: New guidelines have been promulgated by Rome regarding cremation and Catholic funerals. It is important for all Catholics thinking about cremation to be aware of these directives. **First, the Church prefers that Catholics not chose cremation but have the body present. If, however, a family for personal or financial reasons choses cremation, a Catholic funeral Mass may be celebrated but with certain stipulations. First, the cremains must be either buried in hallowed ground in a cemetery or placed in a columbarium (mausoleum) in a cemetery. The cremains may not, under any circumstances, be scattered in the air, over land or at sea. They must be interred. The cremains may not be kept in a private residence. A Catholic funeral Mass or chapel service cannot be celebrated by a priest or deacon if these guidelines are not followed. No Catholic funeral service can be planned or celebrated unless arrangements have been made prior to the funeral for the proper disposition of the cremains through burial or placement in a columbarium.**
