There these fresh young voices sang the Litany of Our

Lady. The next day the little group followed by other children again gathered at the feet of the Mother of God. Next came their mothers to join the little assembly. Soon other groups were formed and the devotion rapidly became popular. Holy souls troubled by disorderly conduct, which always increases and becomes graver at the return of springtime, saw in these growing practices the hand of God. In cooperation with the designs of Providence by approving and promoting this new devotion as a public and solemn act of reparation the Month of Mary was founded.
