Giuseppe Melchiorre Sarto was born in Riese, Venetia, Italy on June 2, 1835. He was the second of 10 children of Giovanni Sarto and Margherita Sanson. He was baptized June 3, 1835. Though poor, his parents valued education. Giuseppe walked 3.7 miles to school every day. St. Pius X was devoted to the blessed Virgin Mary under the title of our Lady of Confidence. He advanced the Liturgical Movement by formulating the principle of participatio actuosa (active participation of the faithful). He encouraged the frequent reception of Holy Communion and lowered the age for first communion. He said Holy

Communion is the shortcut and safest way to heaven. He was known for his firm demeaner and sense of personal property reflected by his membership of the Third Order of St. Francis. Ever mindful of his humble origin, he said, "I was born poor, lived poor, I will die poor". He is known for vigorously opposing Modernist interpretation of Catholic Doctrine and for promoting liturgical reform. Miracles he performed during his lifetime:

*He was holding a paralyzed child who wriggled free from his arms then ran around the room.

*Another miracle involved a couple that made a confession to him while he was Bishop of Mantua. They had a ten-year old child with meningitis. They wrote to him and he wrote back to them to pray and hope. Two days later the child was cured.

He fell ill on August 15, 1914, the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. He died August 20, 1914. After his death, a strong cult of devotion followed his reputation for piety and holiness. He was beatified in 1951 and canonized in 1954 by Pope Pius XII.
