Our Patron Saint
St. Pius X

Last Sunday, August 21st, we celebrated the feast of St. Pius X, our patron. He is worthy of veneration, not only because he is our patron saint but also he is our advocate in heaven, who continues to intercede for us. More than that he is also a miracle worker. In his lifetime and after his death there were many miracles attributed to him. Now we pray that he perform miracles, especially for our sick brothers and sisters. For us Catholics saints play an important role in our Christian life. They are friends of God who did His will alive and models of how we should lead a true Christian life. For our better understanding, let me explain the distinction. The Church teaches that there are three types of honor that are due to those who are holy:

1. Dulia —An honor and recognition we give to the saints. Many of them died as martyrs rather than deny God or they worked great miracles since their friendship with God

meant He granted their prayers healing and restoration or they simply lived holiness in their own little way.

2. Hyperdulia —This is the very special honor we accord to Mary, the Mother of God.
3. Latria —This is the true worship and is given only to God, It is owed to Christ by reason of unity of his divine and human nature in the person of the Word made flesh. As Catholics we don't worship the saints and Mary, we only venerate them. We only worship and adore God, the Trinity of persons Father, Son and Holy Spirit.
