LENT is a 40-day season of prayer fasting and alms giving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Thursday. It is that sacred time when we remember the depths of God's love for us expressed in the mysteries of Christ's passion, death and resurrection. This recollection will be a time to reflect on that mysteries and give thanks for the great and merciful love of God for us. Through prayer, reflection and silence we hope to find

renewal and meaning in our own experience of death and life and let Jesus teach us what it means to be anchored in love and live in hope.

The facilitators for this recollection are Dr. Catherine Morgan a certified Ignatian Spiritual Director and her husband Ralph, Ignatian Spiritual Companion. The couple is recommended by Bishop Solis. This recollection is open to all parishioners of St. Pius X and St. Joseph Monticello but is mandated for all Lectors, Eucharistic Ministers and Ushers. Season of Lent

Lent is a period of penitential preparation for Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 14th for 6 and a half weeks before Easter and provides a 40-day period for fasting and abstinence in imitation of Christ's fasting in the wilderness before he began his public ministry.

The word LENT comes from Middle English word LENTE meaning springtime which is itself descended from the Old English word LENCTEN. It is the springtime of our Soul where we do pious activities like fasting to restrain our bodily desires in order that our soul could soar high to God. We do penance because we are all sinners we need to be sorry for our sins that's why we need confession. Alms giving and prayer help us to be closer to Christ who suffered and died for us. The 40 days of lent are primarily identified with the time Jesus spent in the desert fasting, praying and being tempted by the devil: Mt. 4:1-11

Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting for Catholics from ages 18-59 one full meal, no snacks. Abstinence no meat Catholics from age 14 and above.

Significance of ASH Wednesday

In old testament times people used ashes as a sign of repentance. They would sit in ashes roll around them, sprinkle them upon their head. They did this as outward sign of their inward

posture of repentance: <u>Daniel 9: 3-6.</u> The ashes symbolize our mortality. "Remember you are dust and unto dust you shall return."
