Winter Ordinary Time: Because of the celebration of Christmas on a Sunday, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord was celebrated on Monday, Jan. 9, rather than on the weekend following the Feast of the Epiphany. Winter Ordinary Time began on Tuesday, January 10. During Ordinary Time the liturgical color is green and the Gospel readings are about the life, miracles and teachings of Jesus. We will be in Winter Ordinary Time until Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 1st.

Removing the Christmas Decorations:

Since the Christmas Season ended last Monday, January 9, the Christmas decorations can be taken down. We are planning to remove the decorations this Sunday after the 9:00 a.m. Mass. If you can stay and help take the decorations down, your help will be appreciated. **On** Monday this week they will begin removing the carpet in the sanctuary and replacing it with tile. This is one of the renovation projects planned by the Parish Council. After removing the Christmas decorations, we need help moving everything out of the Sanctuary (except for the altar). The flowers and furniture will be placed in the main body of the Church or in the back sanctuary. Please help up with this move.

Daily Mass This Week: Because the tile team will be removing the carpet and

laying tile in the Sanctuary of the Church this week, daily Mass will be celebrated in the Parish Hall at 5:30 p.m. on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. Please enter through the Parish Hall door on the north side of the Church. (Next weekend Mass will be celebrated in the Church because the tile work should be completed. If there are unexpected problems or delays, next weekend's Masses will also be in the Hall but we are not anticipating a problem.)

Special Collection for the Church in Latin America: Next weekend there is a special diocesan collection to support the Church in Latin America. The money from this collection supports the Catholic communities and missionary work throughout Central and South America where there is the highest percentage of Catholics in the world. Information about this collection and envelope are on the back tables by the bulletins. If you would like to make a donation, put your offering in the envelope and put it into the collection either this weekend or next weekend. (There will not be a second collection taken up at the weekend Masses.)
