Food for the Poor Appeal:

This weekend Father Thomas W. Falkenthal will speak at all the Masses about the ministry of Food for the Poor. This ministry provides direct relief to the poor throughout Latin America and the Caribbean. Father Falkenthal will share his personal witness about the importance of Food for the Poor's mission to care for the destitute as a means of living out the Gospel mandate to love one another.

Father Falkenthal was ordained a priest for the Archdiocese of Chicago in 1975. After serving parishes in Chicago, he entered the U.S. Navy as Commandeer of the Chaplain Corps. He served overseas and retired after 24 years of active duty before joining Food for the Poor. We welcome Father Falkenthal to the Parish.

Fr. Bill on Diocesan Priest Retreat: This week Fr. Bill will be on his annual diocesan priest retreat. There will be no 8:30 a.m. daily Masses celebrated this week. Presiding at these celebrations is not limited to deacons but any trained lay minister can be commissioned by the Diocese to lead the service when a priest is unavailable for Sunday Mass. Next weekend Marian Delay will preside at the services on Saturday and Sunday.
