Confessions: Confessions are heard from 4:15 to 4:45 p.m. on Saturday afternoons or by appointment.

Catholic Lagoon Day: The Annual Catholic Day, sponsored by the Knights of Columbus/Council 602, will be held at Lagoon Amusement Park in Farmington, UT (about 15 miles north of Salt Lake City) on Sunday, August 20. There will be a full day of activities offered beginning at 11:00 a.m. An outdoor Mass will be celebrated at 12 noon. There will be games, food and prizes. There is a discounted Single Day Passport available for participating Catholic for \$37.00 which permits entry to all rides and attractions. This is available at the ticket window by telling the attendant you are there for Catholic Day.

Sacred Heart Mission Mass: This Sunday's Mass at Sacred Heart Mission in La Sal will be the last Mass at the Mission until September. There will be no Mass on the first Sunday in August since this will be Father Rowland's first weekend in his new assignment and a welcome reception is being planned after the 12 noon Mass in Monticello.

Homebound Visits and Sick Calls:

Parishioners are reminded that if someone is sick, homebound or a resident at the Care Center, a family member must call to request a visit. Friends, neighbors or acquaintances may not request a visit from the priest or Communion ministers out of

respect for the privacy and wishes of the sick person and family.

Peter's Pence Collection: This weekend there will be a special diocesan collection called the Peter's Pence Collection (*or the Collection of the Holy Father*). The money from this collection supports the various world-wide special charities identified by our Holy Father, Pope Francis, as needing special assistance. The envelopes for this special collection are in the pew and can be put in with the regular collection next weekend.. (*There will be no second collection taken up next weekend.*)

Pastoral Change: The new pastoral administrator of St. Pius and St. Joseph Parishes, Father Rowland Nwokocha, will arrive in Moab after August 3rd and will be here to celebrate his first Masses in the Parishes on August 5th and 6th. Father Rowland is currently serving as a hospital chaplain for the University of Utah medical center in Salt Lake City. (*Father Bill Wheaton, who has been Pastor at St. Pius Church for eight years, will become Pastor of Holy Family Catholic Church in Ogden, UT.*)
